**MICHAEL J. HOLTZ SELECTED AS FELLOW OF
THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF ARCHITECTS**

Michael J. Holtz, President of Architectural Energy Corporation, was recently notified by Larry Livergood, Secretary of the American Institute of Architects and Betsey Dougherty, Chancellor of the AIA College of Fellows, that he has been elected to The College of Fellows. A Jury of Fellows annually selects those few architects and members of The American Institute of Architects who have made notable and significant contributions to the advancement of the profession of architecture.

Advancement to Fellowship is the highest membership honor bestowed on an architect member of The American Institute of Architects. Founded in 1952, The College of Fellows promotes fellowship among architects, purposes of the AIA and advances to the profession of architecture.

Michael Holtz was recognized by the Jury of Fellows for his more than 30 years of energy and environmental research and design to bring about a more sustainable built environment. Mr. Holtz has served in senior research and leadership positions with the AIA Research Corporation, Solar Energy Research Institute, (now National Renewable Energy Laboratory), and since 1982, Architectural Energy Corporation.

Mr. Holtz was nominated by the Northern Colorado Chapter of The American Institute of Architects, where he is a member and past Director.

"I am honored by the selection to Fellowship and to be among the many distinguished Fellows past and present," Holtz said. "It is gratifying to be recognized for my contributions to improving the energy efficiency and environmental quality of our built environment."

Mr. Holtz will be invested in The College of Fellows at the 2004 National AIA Convention in Chicago. The Investiture Ceremony will be held at 3:30pm on Friday, June 11, 2004, in the Rockefeller Chapel on the campus of the University of Chicago.
